- Earn \$4,000 to work on your startup full-time and receive up to \$1,000 towards business expenses.
- Work one-on-one with JMU alumni entrepreneurs, mentors and industry experts.
- Pitch to investors, friends, faculty and family at Demo Day, where you will be eligible for the \$5,000 Tucker Venture Creation Award and the \$500 Audience Choice Award.



Bluestone Seed Fund



Grow your startup with an investment from the Bluestone Seed Fund. Pitch your startup to the Investment Committee and, if selected, receive \$5,000 in equity seed funding.
